FREEDOM DAY - A COVID UPDATE

The Government guidance relating to COVID-19 has changed, and a lot of restrictions are easing in England. Here's what we are doing to continue keeping you safe.

A very enjoyable event, giving us the chance to meet other local paddling groups including Loughborough Students CC and Loughborough Typhoon Squadron. We also enjoyed the luxury of a support boat in the form of a wide beam canal boat. Thanks to the PLMT staff and volunteers for looking after us.

The good news was, that the canal was relatively free of litter.
